

Wind Symphony Syllabus

Welcome to the Jupiter High School Wind Symphony. You are now in the top performing group of Jupiter High School. This ensemble was specifically hand-picked because of your hard work and practice. Examine the information below and be sure you have all of the information you need to have a successful year. Because this is the top performing group at Jupiter High School, there are high expectations that come along with it. It is expected that you practice daily and come to every class prepared for rehearsal. You are expected to make high grades on all tests and assignments.

Objective: The students in wind symphony will learn basic and advanced techniques of playing a wind instrument. The students will also practice and perform grade 4-6 literature as well as sight read at a proficient level.

Required Materials: Each student is required to have his/her instrument and accessories (oil, mutes, reeds, cloth, etc.) music and folder and a pencils (regular, red, blue) in class each day. Partial list of supplies needed:

Flutes: Pencils, Soft/Clean Cloth, Swab

Reeds (Clarinet, Alto Clarinet, Bass Clarinet, Alto Sax, Tenor Sax, Baritone Sax, Oboe, Bassoon): Pencils, Minimum of 4 Good Single Reeds or 2 Good Double Reeds, Swab, Cork Grease, Soft/Clean Cloth, Reed Holder, Neck Strap – if needed

Brass (Trumpet, French Horn, Trombone, Baritone, Tuba): Pencils, Valve or Slide Oil, Slide Grease, Mouthpiece, Soft/Clean Cloth, Denis Wick metal mute or Trumcor Mute for your instrument.

In Class Requirements: Students are required to perform from memory their 12 major and minor scales at least two octaves in all-state style by the end of the school year. Seating tests and scale test will occur throughout the year and will be *for a grade*.

Performances/Concerts

There will be at least three major concerts throughout the year. There will be mandatory after school rehearsals leading up to these concerts. All performances and rehearsals will be *for a grade* so please plan your schedules accordingly. Remember to frequently check emails and www.jupiterbands.com for times and updates.³

MPA and Wind Symphony Concert Camp

The wind symphony is required to have a concert camp that will take place in **January, 2020** after school. This camp is usually about three days of specialized instruction. Students are also required to participate in the concert music performance assessment (MPA) which is dated on **March 10 or 11**. There will be some extra evening rehearsals leading into MPA. These rehearsals are mandatory for everyone in Concert Band and will be *for a grade*. Please check www.jupiterbands.com for dates and times.

Solo and Ensemble

Students in wind symphony are **required** to participate in Solo and Ensemble on **February 7 or 8, 2020**. Start looking for solos and ensembles **now** so you can start practicing. You must practice daily for this as you will be heard by a state certified judge who will give you both written and verbal comments after your performance. You will be representing Jupiter High School to other music teachers in the state so please make sure you are fully prepared for this! You will be required to play your piece for me *for a grade* before we leave for winter break in December and (with your accompanist if you choose a solo) in its entirety before you play for the judge.
